REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE AUSTRALIAN MUSEUM, FOR THE YEAR ENDING
31ST DECEMBER, 1879.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-IN-CHIEF,—

1. The Trustees of the Australian Museum have the honor to submit to your Excellency this their Twenty-sixth Annual Report.

2. The Museum has been open to the public continuously, Sundays included, throughout the year, and the total number of persons who have visited it is 104,604. The number of persons who have attended on Sundays was 36,604, or an average of 704 visitors for each afternoon. On many occasions the building has been inconveniently crowded, but the conduct of visitors has been decorous and orderly. The Trustees still find it necessary to close the Museum on Monday in each week for the purpose of thoroughly examining and renovating the specimens.

3. The Trustees have been able to procure many and valuable specimens through their collectors. Mr. Broadbent has but recently returned from Tasmania and South Australia with a large collection, a list of which will be found in Appendix X. Mr. Morton has been collecting at Torres Straits, Port Darwin, Port Essington, Bowen (Port Denison), and the adjacent coast, and more recently in and near Port Jackson, so that the collection of the fauna of Port Jackson is becoming more complete.

4. In response to an invitation of the Commissioners of the Sydney International Exhibition, the Trustees prepared an Ethnological Collection for exhibition, many of which specimens they expect to exchange with representatives from other parts of the world; they also hope to acquire donations of specimens for the Natural History collections, and for the proposed Technological and Industrial Museum.

5. The Trustees regret exceedingly that no commencement has been made by the Government in enlarging the Museum, as the want of space in which to exhibit the daily increasing number of specimens is greatly felt. A spacious hall is much required for the proper exhibition of the large vertebrates, such as the skeletons of whales, &c. The Trustees have received from the Director of the Royal Gardens, Kew, through Professor Liversidge, a large series of specimens for the proposed Technological and Industrial Museum, and as it will be impossible to find space for their display in the present Museum, the Trustees purpose applying to the Government for the temporary use of a portion of the Garden Palace for this purpose; they also hope that the Ethnological Collection now on view in the Garden Palace will be allowed to remain there.

6. The delay in opening the collection of Minerals, purchased in Europe by Professor Liversidge, has occurred partly from want of space, but chiefly from want of show cases in which to arrange the specimens—none of the cases in the Museum being suitable for the display of minerals. A few model glass cases to contain these specimens, a microscope, and glass bottles to the extent of £200, were also purchased for the Trustees by Professor Liversidge, who has devoted a great deal of his time to the services of the Museum, both in Europe and in Sydney, where he has been assisting the Curator in classifying and arranging this collection, which will shortly be open to the public.

7. The necessity for a number of cases in which to exhibit and preserve the very large number of specimens becomes more apparent every year, and, until provision is made for the purchase and immediate erection of cases and fittings, the specimens must necessarily suffer and become deteriorated in value. The operations of the Trustees are of necessity limited, owing to the inadequate provision made for the maintenance of the Institution, the Annual Endowment being now no larger than when the Museum was in its infancy. The wages of the servants of the Trustees for the year 1880 exceed the endowment of £1,200, so that there are no funds left for ordinary expenditure. The Trustees are of opinion that an extra annual endowment of £500 for general expenses is absolutely necessary, in order to enable them to carry on the Institution in an efficient manner.

8. Having in view the desirability of making a complete scientific catalogue of the various exhibits at present in the Museum, and describing such of the specimens as are new to science, the Trustees have applied to the Government to place the sum of £300 on the Estimates, to be devoted to secure the services of one or more gentlemen competent to make such a catalogue, in lieu of the £300 formerly voted for the collection of specimens.

9. The Trustees deeply regret the decease of the Hon. Sir Edward Deas-Thomson, C.B., K.C.M.G., who has been Crown Trustee of the Australian Museum since February, 1857, and has always taken great interest in the affairs of the Institution. There have been four other vacancies at the Board during the year,

year, caused by the retirement of Cosby Morgan, Esq., M.D., Edwin Chisholm, Esq., M.D., A. W. Scott, Esq., M.A., and W. J. Stephens, Esq., M.A. The vacancies caused by the resignation of the two former of whom have been filled by the election of W. J. Stephens, Esq., M.A., and Robert Hunt, Esq. The latter vacancies being of a recent date have not yet been filled.
