(REPORT OF TRUSTEES FOR YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE, 1907.)

To HIS EXCELLENCE THE GOVERNOR,—

The Trustees of the Australian Museum have the honor to submit to your Excellency their Fifty-third Report, being for the year ended 30th June, 1907.

1. The Trustees much regret having to report the loss by death of two of their number:—the Hon. James Norton, M.L.C., LL.D., and G. E. Rundle, Esq., F.R.C.S. Dr. Norton had been a Trustee since August, 1874, and always took a keen, active interest in the affairs of the Museum. Dr. Rundle had not been so long a Trustee, having been elected in October, 1901, but his advice and assistance were highly esteemed. The vacant seats were filled by the election of Col. Reuter E. Roth, D.S.O., M.R.C.S., and Eric Sinclair, Esq., M.D., Inspector-General of the Insane. A list of the Trustees, with records of their attendance during the year 1906, will be found in Appendix II.

2. For some time past the necessity of re-grading the Museum staff had been felt by the Trustees, and the resignations and changes reported last year made the position urgent. A request was therefore made for a slight alteration of, and addition to, the Museum vote. This having been granted by Parliament, the necessary steps were taken to give effect to it. A list of the Museum staff, with the positions now held by them, will be found in Appendix VII.

3. The Museum continued open to visitors during the usual hours, viz., from 2 to 5 p.m. on Sundays, and from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on all week-days, except Mondays, which latter were reserved for cleaning purposes; but on Monday afternoons the collections were, as usual, accessible to students and schools for teaching purposes, on application being made to the Curator. The total number of visitors recorded during 1906 was 146,589. The average was 422 on week-days, and 619 on Sundays. The largest attendance on any one day occurred on the 1st October, when 3,033 persons entered the building.

Advantage has been taken of the Monday afternoons by students and scholars, who, with their teachers to the number of 229 persons, visited the Museum for study on these afternoons.

4. The gallery lectures and demonstrations for teachers and students have been continued. There is not at present accommodation to make these available for the general public, and they are therefore prepared only for teachers and students. Tickets for public school teachers are distributed through the Department of Public Instruction. Private school teachers and students receive tickets from the Secretary of the Museum on application.

5. The acquisition of specimens is maintained by means of donations, exchanges, collections—the result of the efforts of the staff and of correspondents—and purchases, so far as funds will permit. Among the most noticeable are:—

A number of very rare insects from Northern Queensland.

Casts of the New South Wales Fossils collected by Professor J. D. Dana during the United States Expedition under Commodore Wilkes, taken from the originals in the possession of the United States National Museum, Washington.

A fine series of Minerals, largely from Broken Hill, including many rare specimens new to the collection, and some that are unique.

Some Historical Casts of ancient Egyptian and Assyrian Monuments, comprising the Chaldean Deluge Tablet, the Moabite Stone, the Siloam Inscription, the Black Obelisk of Shalmaneser II., the Temple Stone, and The Rosetta Stone.

Details of the number of specimens acquired during the year 1906 will be found in Appendix IV.

6. The Trustees were offered a splendid collection of ethnological specimens of the Pacific Islands, New Zealand, and Australia, but regret the funds at their disposal did not admit of its purchase. The collection being located outside of the Commonwealth would have involved the payment of a heavy Customs duty, which, added to the purchase money, rendered the price prohibitive.

The Trustees take this opportunity of drawing attention to the Commonwealth tariff, and its injurious effects on this and other Australian museums. They are of opinion that specimens and articles for museums should be admitted free. Natural history specimens are so, but reproductions, casts of historical, or other authentic specimens, ethnological objects, and material in general, are charged on the ground that they are curios, fancy goods, or such like. They are not brought into the country as merchandise, but simply as exhibits for educational purposes, and as a rule they are not articles that are manufactured in Australia. Articles for universities and colleges are exempted from duty, but museums, which are also educational institutions (although not so admitted by the Federal Customs) are not exempted: The omission of the word "Museums" from the exemption clause was possibly merely an oversight.

7. Two of the Zoologists (Messrs. C. Hedley and A. R. McCulloch) were invited by Professor W. A. Haswell, F.R.S., M.A., &c., of the University of Sydney, to accompany him during dredging operations carried out under the auspices of the Government Grant Committee of the Royal Society of London, on board H.M.C.S.S. "Miner" and the S.S. "Woy Woy," in the Tasman Sea, off Port Jackson. Some portion of the results of these investigations have been, and others will be, published in the "Records of the Australian Museum."

8. The Trustees are pleased to report that the collections continue to be maintained in good order, although the congested state of the Museum prevents their public display to full advantage. During the past year steps were taken to bring this matter under the notice of the Hon. the Minister of Public Instruction and of the Hon. the Premier and Treasurer. The Trustees anticipate a satisfactory result in the near future, by the extension of the new south wing, erected in 1897, to join the main building.

9. A new Department of the Museum has been established, to be called the "Historical Section," for the purpose of receiving and preserving specimens (not documents) relating to the early history of Australia, and other articles of historical interest that may come into the possession of the Trustees from time to time. Hitherto these have been classed with the Ethnological Section, but there are, besides the "Cook Relics," a sufficient number to justify the formation of a separate section for their reception. Two noteworthy specimens have been received during the year—A portion of the tree marked by Deputy Surveyor-General G. W. Evans, in 1815, on Mandajery Creek, at its junction with the Lachlan River, bearing his name and date, was sent to the Museum by the Hon the Minister for Lands; and a portion of one of the iron boats used by Sir Thomas L. Mitchell, Surveyor-General, on his journey to explore "Tropical Australia" in 1845-6. The tree in question marked the furthest inland point reached up to that date by white men; the Mitchell boat-portion was found near Wallerawang.

10. The library continues to increase rapidly, and additional space is much required for the erection of more bookcases. The library proper now contains only periodicals, publications of societies, and general works. Books relating to special subjects have been transferred to the scientific workrooms, and cases for their reception erected there, or in the corridors, where all available space is taken up.

11. The Government inquiry by the Public Service Board into the management of the scientific institutions of the State has now been completed. A permanent advisory Museums Committee has been formed, of which Mr. R. Etheridge, Curator of the Australian Museum, was appointed Vice-President, with the Trustees' approval.
