& Ring" marked
stone (of which
we have a cast
at the Museum)
crossed B capstone
hill down to the
dam. From thence
past Wells' house
up the hill
to the Panorama

Rocks two of
which had some
splendid illus-
trations of Cup
Ring & Ladder
Markings - From
there to Hkley Station
& joined our friends
who had been
to worship &
then walked to
Burley & concluded
the evening with
music - This
day of May

20 Went out in the
afternoon -- but
it rained afterwards.

21 H H C C in the
morning Headz Church
in the evening

meeting of L N S
& after Club Meeting
Garnell left me
the lecture on a
piece of slate.

23 Had a lesson
on Botany at
night private
study

24 Left Leeds at
7.35 for Malton
with Toebuck we
met Kumbly at
Malton station &
went on to Habor
& then caught the
10.10 train to
Kirkham walked
from there to
Malton about
9 Miles & arrived
soon after 4-0
we went along
the river side
all the way [60]

going very leisurely
did not see many
birds but plants
were in profusion
I have taken the
vasculum and
filled it. Insects
(Lepidoptera) not
numerous saw
one Dragon fly. +
made notes of the
fish given to me
by the local
fishermen - when
we arrived at
Malton Mr. Slater

met us and took
us thro' his gardens
to his home where
we had tea after
which Kumbley
left us to go to
dinner at a
friends house this
is why he wanted
me to go on the
arranging excursion
Chadwick came
in & together we
visited rooms &
& persons likely
to give information

left Malton at 8.30
& arrived at Leeds
about 11.40. I
pressed the plant
which I had got
& went to bed about
12.0.
