Aug 30. Returned with  
Father from our Holidays  
in Ireland. In the  
afternoon Mr Hartley  
came in & told me that  
the grey cat which had  
been "at the birds" many  
times during our absence  
was in the garden -

I took the gun & shot  
it dead. Mrs Mellish  
who was in the garden  
was startled by the shot  
as her husband came  
to our door & charged  
me with nearly shooting  
his wife pooh! I said  
nonsense he would  
have me go with him  
When I found the woman

in a considerable state  
of excitement. Mellish  
threatened to find the  
owner of the Cat and  
get me into trouble. in  
the evening I had a  
walk up Altey road  
through the fields Spenn  
dene Kirkstall.

31 Went to the Museum  
to see how things were  
getting on found that  
Grasshopper had received  
all the birds I sent  
but not in very good  
condition owing to the  
time taken in transit  
Paid J W Smith £  
£ 4. 8. 0 for my new  
grey suit.

Braunson I was told  
called to see me on  
Wednesday so I returned  
the visit this morning  
he wanted me to take  
charge of the excursion  
to Ribstone to day I  
afterwards saw both  
Walker & Addyman.

Found letter awaiting  
me from C.C. Smith  
Craven Nat Club  
asking for assistance  
with syllabus. I wrote  
& promised a paper for dec  
9<sup>th</sup> "Flyng Walking and  
Riding" to be  
illustrated with lantern  
& expenses to be paid  
also letter from

Backhouse asking  
for report of Vertebrate  
Section - got new  
camera stand from  
White

Sep. 1. 4 H.C.C in morning  
Commenced lecture on  
life of Mammals for  
Museum Lecture. In  
the afternoon had a walk  
I thro' Meanwood, Stainbeck  
Lane & Meanwood Wood.

2. Recommeuced duties at  
the Museum. My face has  
commenced to swell again  
so at noon I went to Birch  
to have the tooth drawn  
he was however engaged  
but asked me to call  
tomorrow.

W.H.W.W. Called at  
the Museum & told me  
that Father was going  
up to Fallowfield Terrace  
to tea & asked me to go  
also. I promised to do so  
but should have to leave  
in time for Club meeting  
at 7.30. Went to tea as  
arranged & found Mr  
Wilkinson the only represen-  
tative of the family the  
rest being in Switzerland.  
Attended meeting of L.H.C  
which was to examine the  
results of the excursion  
of Saturday to Ribstone  
I was voted to the chair  
& learned that only one  
member had put in an

appearance so the excursion  
was not held. there being  
"no exhibits & no remarks"  
& seeing that the evening  
was going to be a failure  
I gave an hour &  $\frac{1}{2}$  on  
Connemara & my Irish  
tour left at 8.45 - ) - v 9

Brownridge has in his shop  
an albino Java Sparrow.

3 At noon I went to Birch  
as arranged and he drew  
my tooth under Nitrous  
Oxide my second experience -  
this time I knew nothing -  
of what was taking place  
Gurnell called to see  
me at the Museum. Dr.  
Leale called with his  
Son & inspected the

cases fitted with his  
filtration system and  
was well satisfied with  
the result. Recommended  
the adoption in the Bird  
Cases. - Birch lent me  
Grays Anatomy.

4. Made further progress  
with my lecture on the  
Life of Mammals. Letter  
from Craven Nat Ass<sup>n</sup>  
asking me to change  
date of Lecture from Dec  
9<sup>th</sup> to the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Replied  
stating that as the Annual  
Meeting of the Nat Club  
was fixed for this date  
I could not attend; but  
Dec<sup>2</sup> 16<sup>th</sup> would suit  
me.

5 Gurnell called at North  
Dane brought me from  
Paris a pin set with a  
piece of Connemara Marble  
Grassham gave me 2 Ju  
Swallows taken at Eccup  
and 1 adult at Collingham  
Wrote to Mr Stuart Westport  
Sent him  $\frac{1}{4}$  lb of  
Naphthaline.

6 Got up at 4.45 and  
Grassham called according  
to arrangement we went  
to the farm but I got  
nothing he shot 2 ♀ Chat-  
-fuches 1 Blue Tit and 1  
Song Thrush. Yesterday  
I gave College notes of  
shells from Ireland for  
Meeting of Conchological

Society and saw Crossfield  
who invited me to see  
him at Lane End Horsforth.  
Raymond came and  
spent the night.

7. Showed him round  
the Museum wrote to  
Backhouse re Vertebrate  
~~Section~~ to Clarke and  
to Crossfield saying I  
might call on him  
this afternoon. Gave  
Furnell balance of  
photos & figures. After  
tea I walked to Horsforth  
& called at Crossfield's  
house it is nearly at  
Rawdon but as I did  
not get there until 7.0  
he had gone out. Came

back by train  
8 Did not go to church  
to day. In the morning  
I finished the Bats of  
my lecture & after tea  
walked to New Deeds I  
to see Mrs Mann by the  
Ridge but found that  
she was away from  
home walked home by  
Chapeltown & Stanbeck  
Lane.

9 Post Card from Backhouse  
saying in reply to my  
letter that he would  
be at the Museum this  
morning. Letter from  
W Bland giving me a  
list of his eggs to be  
look my pictures of

Fieldfare & Hooroe to the  
Art Gallery but found  
I could not exhibit them  
without becoming a member  
of the Art Union of Yorks'  
so paid the necessary \$7.  
Subscription & entered  
my works for competition

Backhouse called and  
I promised to subscribe to  
his book - "Hand book to  
the European Birds"

10 Miall came down to  
Museum and I arranged  
to have my lantern slides  
made at the College as  
before. Went on the ridge  
at night. Both the turtle  
doves eggs hatched yesterday.  
Took home the articles

on Mammalia in the  
voyage of the Beagle. from  
Phil. Library. Some boys  
lived a Lt. St. which  
they brought to me

11. Called on Birch & we  
went together to see ~~at~~  
Addyman who asked me  
to take charge of the  
Vertebrate section at Zley  
on Saturday this I agreed  
~~to do.~~ wrote to W Bland &  
told him I might see  
him on Saturday at Scarbo'
12. Called on Roebuck &  
wrote up my Y.M.C.A. Cash Book  
Spent most of the evening  
at the life of Mammals  
having now to commence  
the "Burrowers"

13 went out at 5.30 to  
the farm & shot a  
Missel Thrush they are  
now going in flocks.  
Addyman called and  
gave me the necessary  
Railway permit for the  
excursion tomorrow Marsh  
reminded of affiliation  
of Leeds Nat Club to the  
British Association at  
Leeds next year so I  
at once wrote to Newcastle  
where they are now  
meeting, At night had  
a walk thro' the Park  
14 Leeds Naturalists' Club  
excursion to Filey - Left  
Leeds at 9.5 in charge  
& at York we were met

by Addyman, Davis  
& a Middlebro' man.  
Arrived at Filey at 11.39  
went to the "Crown" &  
had some refreshment  
then took a cobble for  
the rest of the day. 5  
of us went in the boat  
Addyman Walker Self  
& 2 others, the remainder  
working the Rock Pools.  
After we had been out  
an hour we had to  
~~but~~ put Walker & another  
off. We worked with a  
dredge & tow-net. The  
dredge we hauled in  
4 times. Saw but  
few birds nearly  
all gulls. 1 Guillemot

\* a flock of ducks  
Tufted? went ashore  
& left Filey at 6.12  
for Scarborough here I left  
them & made my way  
to Bar St & had tea  
with the Blaunds, returned  
to the station & departed  
for Leeds at 8.0 having  
an engaged carriage  
we bolted our catches  
in the train when  
we arrived at Leeds  
I went to the Exchange  
Club with Addyman  
had some coffee and  
came to Headingley by  
train arriving about  
12.0.

15 H H C C in the morning

& & in the evening  
J. A. Reid brought me  
a Gold Crest which  
he had found dead  
on Mr. Berry's door  
step. Went for a walk  
to Kirkstall, Woodside  
Open Lane &c.

16 Letter from Clarke  
& received vanishing  
notice for my pictures  
at the exhibition - Sep  
28<sup>th</sup> Sent Grasshopper  
to Station for our Filey  
Specimens. Look out  
the shark in Yarrell  
& found it to be the  
Common Gope (*Gallus*  
*canis*) Made a water  
color drawing of it in

Some color which I  
borrowed from Brownridge  
there learned that  
Booth is seriously ill.  
Supposed tumour on the  
brain. In the afternoon  
Addyman came to the  
Museum & we went  
thro' our captures. Made  
out a small fish to be  
the Shanny (Blennius  
pholis) & Barnacles to  
be *Balanus balanoides*.  
& Star fish to be *Ophiura*  
*albeda* & *Ophiothrix*  
*fragilis*. Addyman took  
the Hydrozoa & Polyzoa.  
At night I presided  
at meeting of L. & C.  
exhibited drawings of

Tope dissected out  
Barnacle to show Cirri  
Gave list of Birds &c.  
J A Reid came up & showed  
me his clock. - Wrote  
to Mr Booth respecting  
his son.

17. Went out with the  
Junc in the morning  
but did not get any-  
thing. At 10.15 I went  
to help Addyman with  
report of L. N Club  
Meeting & found him  
with Kirkby. Kirkby  
handed me a case of  
2 Nutcrackers saying  
they were for the Club  
but he afterward said  
he would give them

to me, Adderman was  
there & said he would  
not stand in the way  
but I modified  
the matter, by taking  
one & leaving the other  
for the Club. took the  
case away for the  
purpose of separating  
the birds - wrote to  
Clarke, went into the  
Market & bought a  
young dead Goldfinch 1<sup>d</sup>

18 About finished my  
lecture, telephoned to  
Twigg & said I would  
go up to the Reformatory  
tonight. bought in  
the Market. Obstetrics 1/6.  
at night I went to

the Reformatory & brought  
back with me Transforma-  
tions of insects by Drucas  
to work out the collection  
in the Museum. I left  
Mr. Zivig Shaps Therapeutics  
19 fixed wire netting in  
front of aviary sent out  
some young gulls put  
into Skin Cabinet the Gulls  
etc which I got in Ireland  
20 Storey called at Museum  
worked out some Orders of  
Insecta for Transformation  
Collection in Museum.

21 Went out to the farm  
in the morning thought  
I heard a fieldfare fired  
at a thrush in mistake  
for a Redwing

In the afternoon I went  
out to Burley Kirkdale  
in coming home thro'  
the Park saw the Yeomanry  
at work & stayed to watch  
them

22 did not go to church  
to day in the morning  
Father & I, walked passed  
Adel Dale & home by  
Weetwood I shot with  
the W Stick gun a Robin  
which I blew to pieces.

23 The great Tit died this  
morning - Grassham had  
promised to go out with  
me but he did not turn  
up letters from Mr Stuart  
At night went to L.H.C.  
Geol: Exhibits Saw Pickard

I walked home with  
him as far as Hyde  
Park I went down  
Victoria Road

24 In the afternoon I  
attended lecture in  
Phil Hall by Prof.  
Beaumont on Textile  
industries. At night  
I went with the Major  
& his daughters to the  
"feast" at Woodhouse  
but we did not stay  
very long.

25 Gurnell called about  
our arrangement for  
learning German together  
26 Went out with the  
Sun this morning result  
Nil saw the Hawk

again which I made  
out to be a Kestrel.  
At noon I took back  
to Hewetson his Thompson's  
Birds of Ireland - he  
showed me some skins &  
he had a chat about  
corporation aviaries at  
Roundhay Park & thought  
of suggesting the idea  
to the Committee

27. Got some boards at  
at Dennis in order  
to bind Naturalist's  
World and the Field  
Naturalist and at  
night stitched the  
sheets. Mr. Stuart  
sent me a Ringed  
Plover from Westport

the receipt of which  
I acknowledged.

28. Got the sheets cut  
at McCorquodales.

Varnishing day at  
the Art Gallery went  
to see my drawings &  
found them hung in  
the Elementary Competition  
Class met Henderson  
in the Gallery. In the  
afternoon I went to  
Meadowood & home by  
the wood. At night had  
a walk with the Major &c

29 H N C in the morning  
& Headingley Church  
at night.

30 Went to the farm &  
fired at a Wheatear.

it struggled into a hedge, but when I tried to seize it, it passed thro' into a turnip field & I could not find it. On looking at the place where I shot it I found 7 of its tail feathers & others sufficient to identify it by. Saw the Hawk again. Got some wood cut to make a case for Micrura Caryocatactes. - At night I attended at Yorkshire College to hear Wager on development of a fungus. D.N.C. Private view day at the Art Gallery. I spent

most of the time in  
the photo room with  
Washington Teasdale

Oct 1. Grasham came  
up at 4.45 & we  
went to the Park. I  
did not get a shot  
he got Troglodytes  
harculus. Erythacus  
rubecula & ♀ Virella  
Cœlebs with my little  
gun. Saw several  
fieldfares very wild  
Last Wednesday there  
was sent to the Museum  
a Richardson's Skua  
in the flesh by F.B.  
Charlesworth Settee  
for identification &  
preservation. I afterwards

Saw Roeback promised  
him a rôle for the  
Naturalist. Knobley  
Called at the Museum  
~~I~~ Wrote Dixon re transformation  
of Bee. This  
morning I was told  
that several people  
had heard strange  
noise in Dentys Wood  
& that those living  
near couldn't sleep  
for it. About 6.30  
to night Alice told  
me that she could  
hear it from our  
Cellar so I went out  
it was dusk and I  
heard a Barn Owl  
shrieking in pine

style. Went over the road & behind Stone Place, here I saw the bird in a tree above me very clearly. Went back for my gun but when I returned the bird had gone. Some boys who were there said they saw it come to the ground while I was away but a dog which they had with them began to bark & so frightened the owl.

Bound the Nat. world

2 I was told this morning that the bird had again been

Heard at F.O. Dixon  
Called in response to  
my letter & I arranged  
to go to Burnhampton  
tomorrow. Took 2 Vols  
of Cassell's Nat Hist  
& Brit Mus: Guide to  
York's College to Mrs  
Ramsden to make  
my lantern slides  
Rev. Mr Bell called  
at the Museum & told  
me that he let a  
Chaffinch which he  
had caught last  
winter 15 times & it  
returned every time  
until the spring came  
when it disappeared  
Wrote to Doten and

enclosed money for  
birds which I got  
him to stuff for  
Dr Atkinson at night  
I listened for the Owl  
until 7.0 dusk but did  
not hear it & so went  
to see Scott as arranged  
Spent the evening with  
him he gave me an  
elementary book on  
Botany.

4. The Owl had not been  
heard at all last night  
Sent some more books  
to the College by Graham  
Went to see Dixon  
We put on the nets &  
Went to the hives. & took  
out brood to & caught

the Queen of one hive  
with a parasite on it  
this is the first Dixon  
had seen, got Bees  
Lava Cells &c for the  
Museum \$1 & some cut  
wood for boxes for self  
25 for  $\frac{1}{2}$  & also a box  
of honey  $\frac{1}{2}$ , Mr. Stuart  
sent me a stonechat &  
a rock pipit. - Note from  
Prof Miall ~~ask~~ enclosing  
letter from J Moorhouse  
re snakes & asking me  
call on him. at 145  
Belle Vue Road. Wrote  
to Westport. Went to  
Mechanics at night  
& attended elementary  
German Class but

the master thought  
I was fitted for  
the advanced class  
to which I stayed  
but I was not at  
all pleased with my  
progress

4. At night I went to  
145 Belle Vue Rd I  
& saw the snakes from  
India Moorhouse was  
not in he as a member  
of the L.H.C. - Sent up  
some more diagrams  
to the College. drew  
bones of birds' wing.  
Cut some glasses for  
boxes I got from Dixon  
intending to make  
them into egg boxes.

5 Letter from Collinge  
at 31 Southampton Rd  
Babury where he  
has gone to live. I  
replied to it. In the  
afternoon had a walk &  
as far as the Abbey &  
thro' the Park. At night  
commenced to bind the  
"Field Naturalist"

6. H H C C. in the morning  
after tea Gurnell came  
up & he Miss Green &  
myself had a walk to  
Meanswood. Booth died  
to day

7. Gurnell brought me  
a Conversational Guide  
in German &c. I  
mounted some parasites

to show at the Club  
tonight when I got  
home Father said  
that Considering the  
bad night he did  
not care to go to  
the festival rehearsal  
so gave me me the  
ticket. We had  
Midsummer Night;  
Dream Conducted by  
Sullivan. The Sword  
of Aragon Conducted  
by the Composer. <sup>7</sup>  
Corder. & the Voyage of  
the Maeldune Also  
Conducted by the Composer  
V Stanford. I did  
not in consequence  
attend the Club

meeting. On Sunday  
Father shot a wren  
in the garden with  
the walking stick.

This morning I spoke  
to Mr. Booth who said  
that an invitation  
would be sent to  
me for Wall's funeral.  
I had intended going  
but my Dawson's of  
Picidae & Corvidæ to  
Conversazione of Salem  
Church

8. At night went  
to the opening lecture  
of the Phil So: New Session  
Lord Carnarvon on  
Liberty of Speech.  
Letter from William Booth

I arranged to go to  
New Bedford to tea  
tomorrow at Mr.  
Mawes I

g. Father shot a Starling  
with the stick gun  
this morning. Cleared  
Corals. &c in Bird  
room. At 2.30 I  
went to Mr. Booth's  
House for the funeral  
Scott Abbott & myself  
were the only friends  
of Walters asked.  
funeral at Woodhouse  
Cemetery. On leaving  
the Museum I went  
to New Bedford to bring  
home Miss Green who  
had gone to pay a

visit to Mr. Maini  
10. Went to Art Gallery  
at noon & at night  
got the 1<sup>st</sup> Volume  
of the English Illustrated  
Magazine ready for  
stitching - In the  
morning I went out  
into the garden and  
shot *Erythacus rebecc-*  
*-ula* with Catapult  
Mounted Starling in  
altitude of picking  
an elderberry &c from  
a bunch below its  
feet letter from Miss  
Beale to which I  
replied - Went to  
Goodall Suddecks  
& had a lesson in

Bookbinding -  
The last day or two  
I have learned the  
Lords' prayer in  
German from the  
Book Burnell left  
on the 7<sup>th</sup>

11. Mounted the Robin.  
Went to library at  
noon & looked at Buttons  
plates. At night I  
stitched Vol I May:  
12 Went to 3 Horse Shoes  
at 2.15 to lead any  
recorders who might  
turn up to excursion  
of L & C. Adel. I was  
the only representative  
& so had a walk to  
Adel Church along

the old Otley Rd and  
back by Dawsonwood  
called to see Irvine.  
The wet weather had  
deterrred other members  
of HCC in the morning.  
but did not go out  
otherwise.

14. packed up all my  
lantern slides of  
lectures to be called at  
College & told Miss  
Pawson to photo  
the Kangaroo. Received  
Reply from British  
Association in reply  
to my letter to have  
Leeds Nat Club affiliated  
with their meeting in  
1890 at Leeds.

On Sat 12 I received  
Syllabus from Graven  
Nat Club & found my  
name down as "Curator  
Leeds Museum" &  
also a lecture by  
Miall so I wrote him  
& asked if I should give  
instructions to have  
the Malters put right  
he replied it was of  
no consequence.

20 day Monday I sent  
skins &c to Nat Club  
& sent Rolback a  
note on Richardson's  
Sketch for Naturalist  
Gurnell called and  
arranged to meet me  
for German on Thursday

Went to Winterhalter  
had 2 negatives  
taken of myself one  
3/4 & one profile he  
would let me have  
rough proofs on Wed.  
filled up forms for  
 lantern Slides for  
 woodpeckers & life of  
 Mammals. Received  
 syllabus of seeds  
 Geol Ass<sup>n</sup> first  
 Meeting on 17<sup>th</sup>  
 did not go to Z.R.C.

15. Went into Market  
 & bought a Bernicle  
 goose for 1/3 from Anna  
 on the Solway. Commenced  
 to rewrite my lecture  
 on life of Mammals

At night I stitched  
the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vol of the May  
16 On my way to  
business I called  
on Thos Dawson & got  
an order for Lecture  
at Mechanics Institute  
to night on Bird life  
Past & Present. & received  
an ac<sup>e</sup> from Smith's for  
repairing a Coat for  
10/6. & had a row with  
them about it & finally  
paid 5/3. Received  
Nomination forms for  
Geol Ass= On asking  
Lowe he gave me another  
pass for the lecture so  
I took Miss Green. J. O.  
Arnold of Firth College

Sheffield on Birds - life  
past & present a very  
"popular" lecture.

17 Attended opening  
meeting of new session  
Geol Ass: & proposed  
Gurnell & Pickard as  
new members. At  
noon Gurnell came to  
Museum & we had a  
turn at German. Got  
my lecture slides from  
College. Miall came  
down & said the lecture  
matter was in the  
hands of Mr Hargrave  
& he was afraid it  
was not making much  
progress.

18 Letter from Keighley

Sci: Ass: asking me for  
title of lecture. I gave  
them Life of Mammals  
& asked them to give me  
an early date. Wrote  
to Hy Hyde 29 Ardwick  
Green N. Manchester  
for 3 frogs.
